授業方針・テーマ	This is a required course for students in the Global Education Program upon completion of their study abroad. Offered in an intensive format during the spring or summer break, this is a seminar-style class, based on student presentations and interactive discussion among students and professors. It offers students the opportunity to reflect on their study abroad experiences and work with fellow students with different and diverse experience, while also providing an interactive environment for students to clarify their career goals and explore suitable career paths based on both their study in their professional field and their study abroad experience.					
習得できる知識・能力や 授業の目的・到達目標	Drawing on their study abroad experiences, students are expected to demonstrate their ability to analyze contemporary issues in their respective fields from a global perspective, discuss potential solutions and prospects and apply academic skills and research approaches. In their individual presentation, students will be required to present their study at TMU in their own professional field and their study abroad experience connecting with their own career plan. In group presentation, groups composed of three or four students who studied abroad in different parts of the world will decide on one theme that group members found interesting during their study abroad experience.
